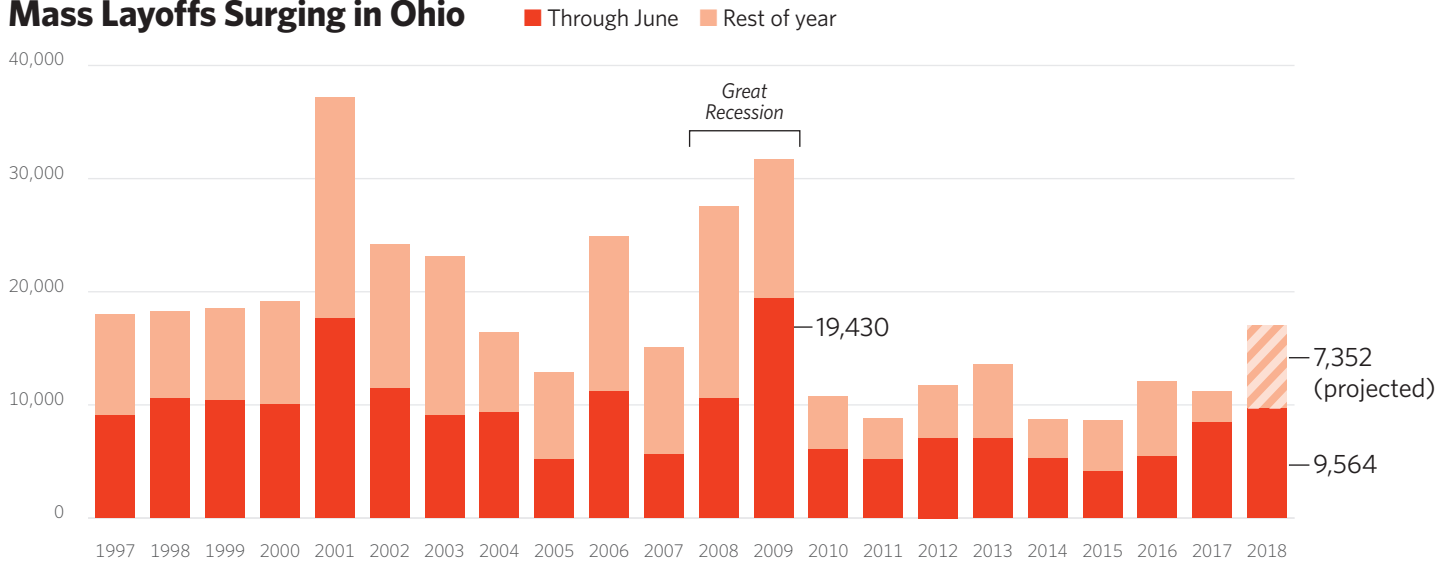


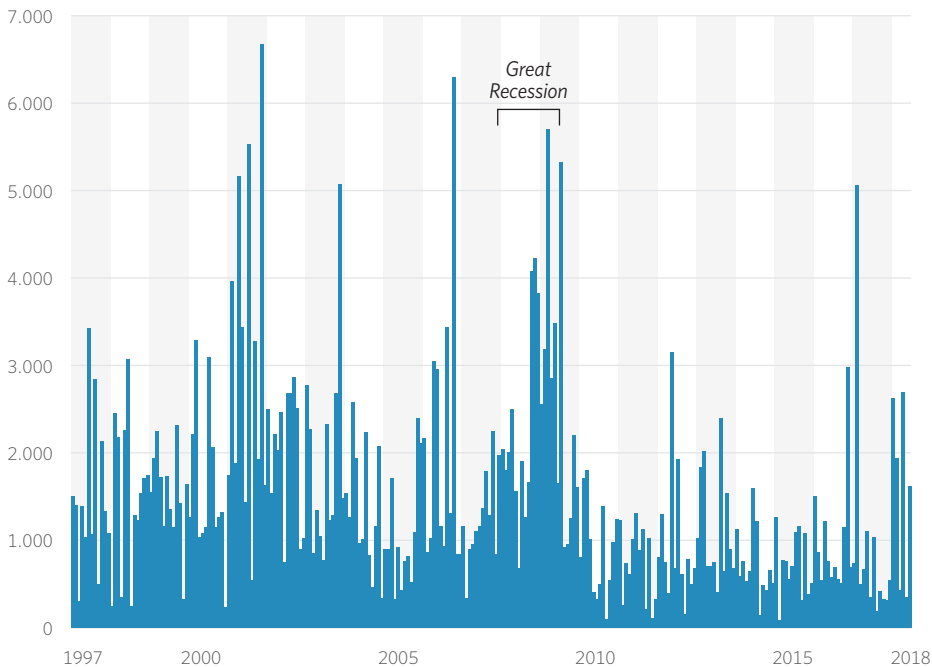
Ohio's Recovery Hindered by Mass Layoffs

While job opportunities in Ohio have increased, there are signs the state may not be making the most of the strong national economy. Jobs lost in the state from mass layoffs have spiked in 2018. Over the first six months of the year, there have been 9,564 such layoffs, the highest year-to-date total since the Great Recession. If recent trends continue, Ohio may see more than 7,300 additional layoffs in 2018.

Mass Layoffs Surging in Ohio

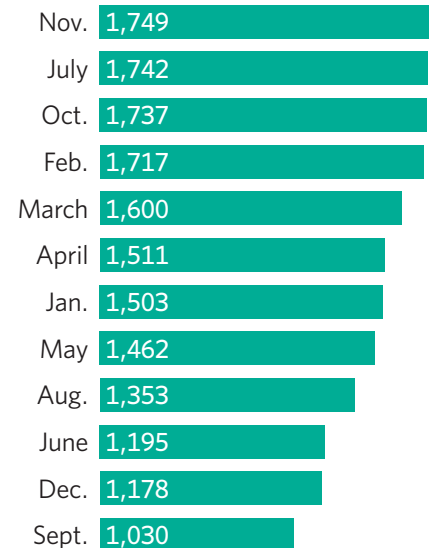


Monthly Mass Layoffs in Ohio
