
Ohio's Recovery Hindered by Mass Layoffs


While job opportunities in Ohio have increased, there are signs the state may not be making the most of the strong national economy. Since the Great Recession, Ohio has lost about 11,000 jobs each year through mass layoffs, and 2019 is on track to nearly reach that figure. Through October, there have been **8,800 such layoffs**. If recent trends continue, Ohio may see **1,500 additional layoffs** this year.
