
Ohio's Recovery Hindered by Mass Layoffs


While job opportunities in Ohio have increased, there are signs the state may not be making the most of the strong national economy. Jobs lost in the state from mass layoffs have spiked in 2018. Through November, there have been **12,000 such layoffs**, the second-highest year-to-date total since the Great Recession. If recent trends continue, Ohio may see **775 additional layoffs** in December 2018.
