

Ohio's Recovery Hindered by Mass Layoffs

While job opportunities in Ohio have increased, there are signs the state may not be making the most of the strong national economy. Since the Great Recession, Ohio has lost about 11,000 jobs each year through mass layoffs, and 2019 appears to be close to that average. Through August, there have been **7,770 such layoffs**. If recent trends continue, Ohio may see **2,580 additional layoffs** this year.
