
Ohio's Recovery Hindered by Mass Layoffs

While job opportunities in Ohio have increased, there are signs the state may not be making the most of the strong national economy. Ohio has lost an average of **909 jobs from mass layoffs each month** since 2010, or 10,909 per year. While last year was below average, 2018 had the second-highest yearly total since the Great Recession.




Mass Layoffs in Ohio
