
### OHIO PRIVATE-SECTOR EMPLOYMENT (MILLIONS)


#### YEAR-TO-YEAR (DECEMBER TO DECEMBER) CHANGE IN JOBS IN OHIO, IN THOUSANDS

Missouri became a Right-to-Work state in 2017 but returned to Forced-Unionization in 2018.
