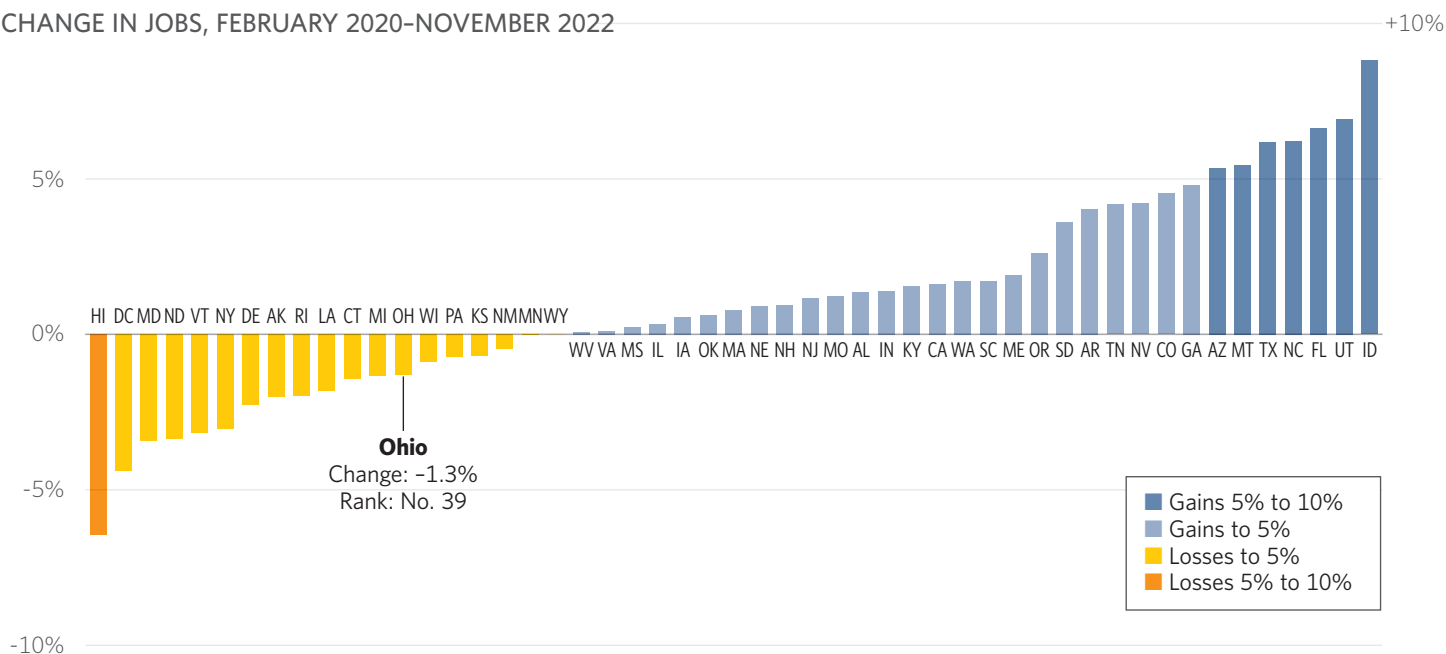

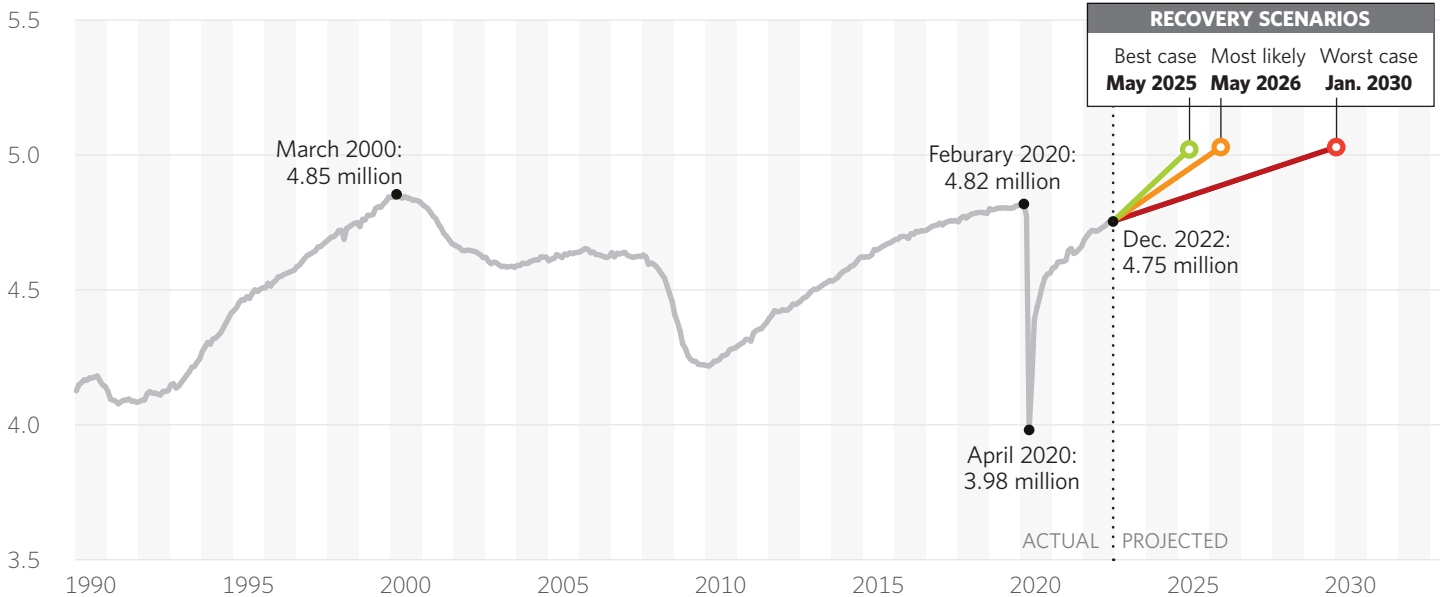

OHIO PRIVATE-SECTOR EMPLOYMENT, IN MILLIONS



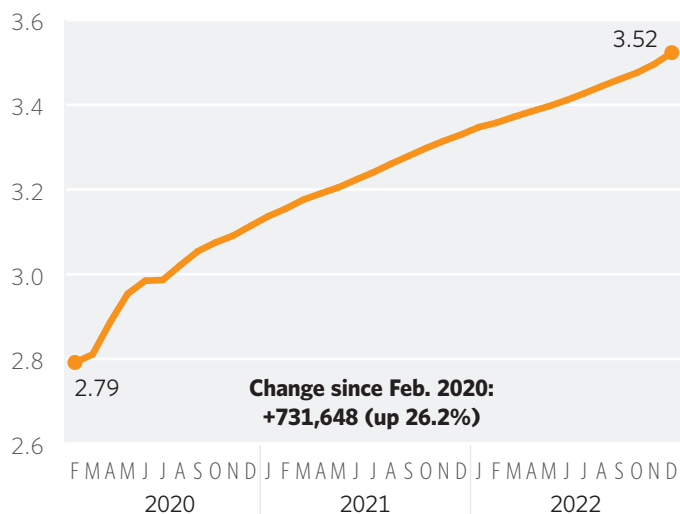

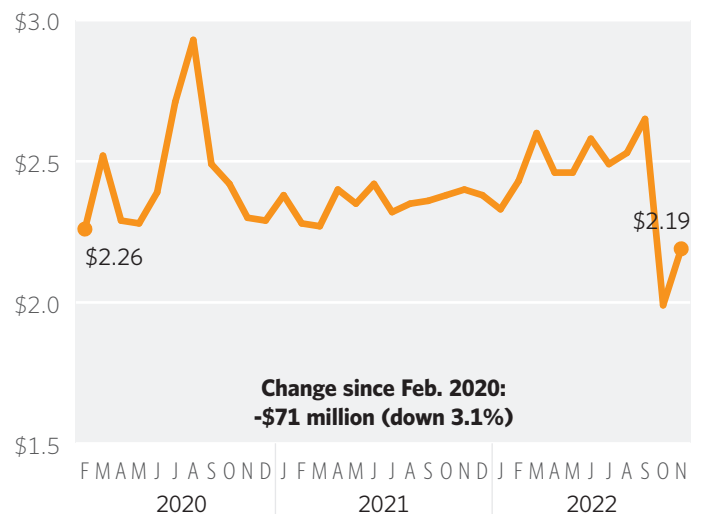


Changes to Ohio Medicaid
