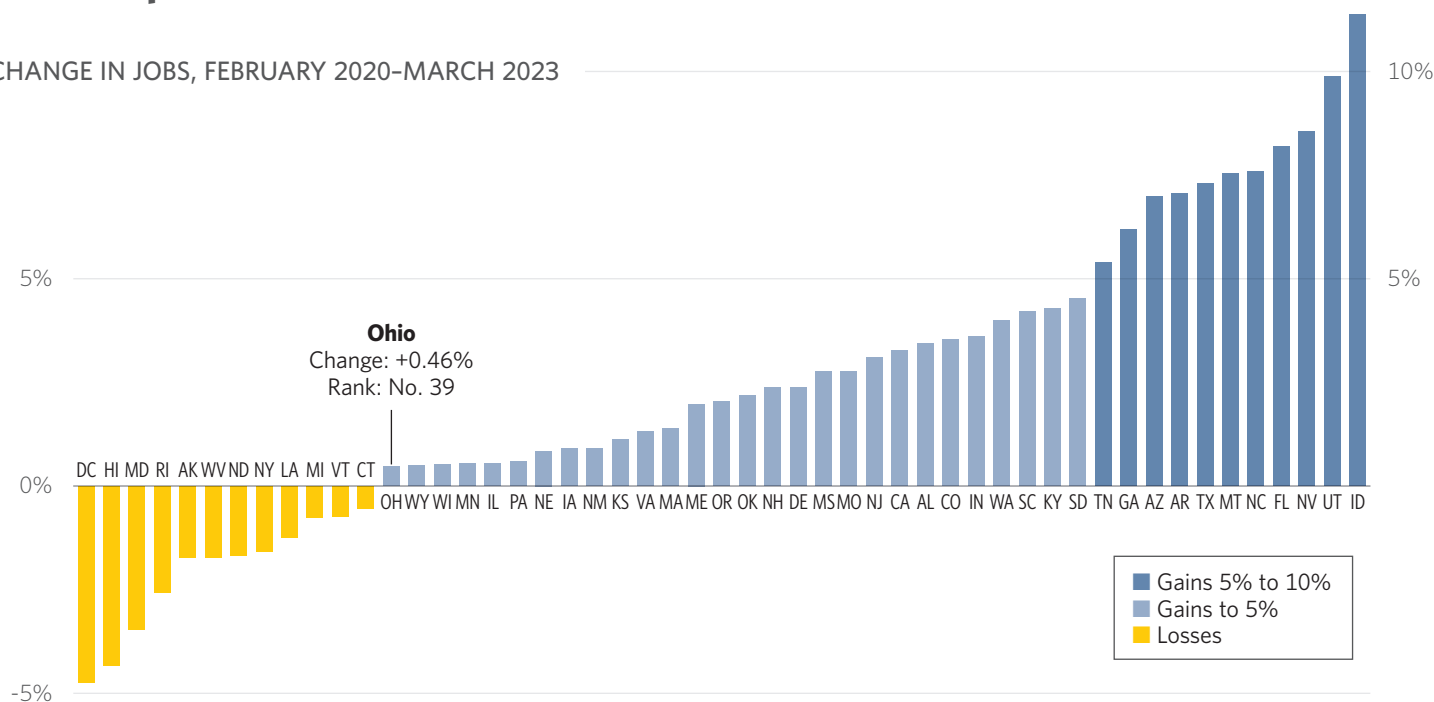

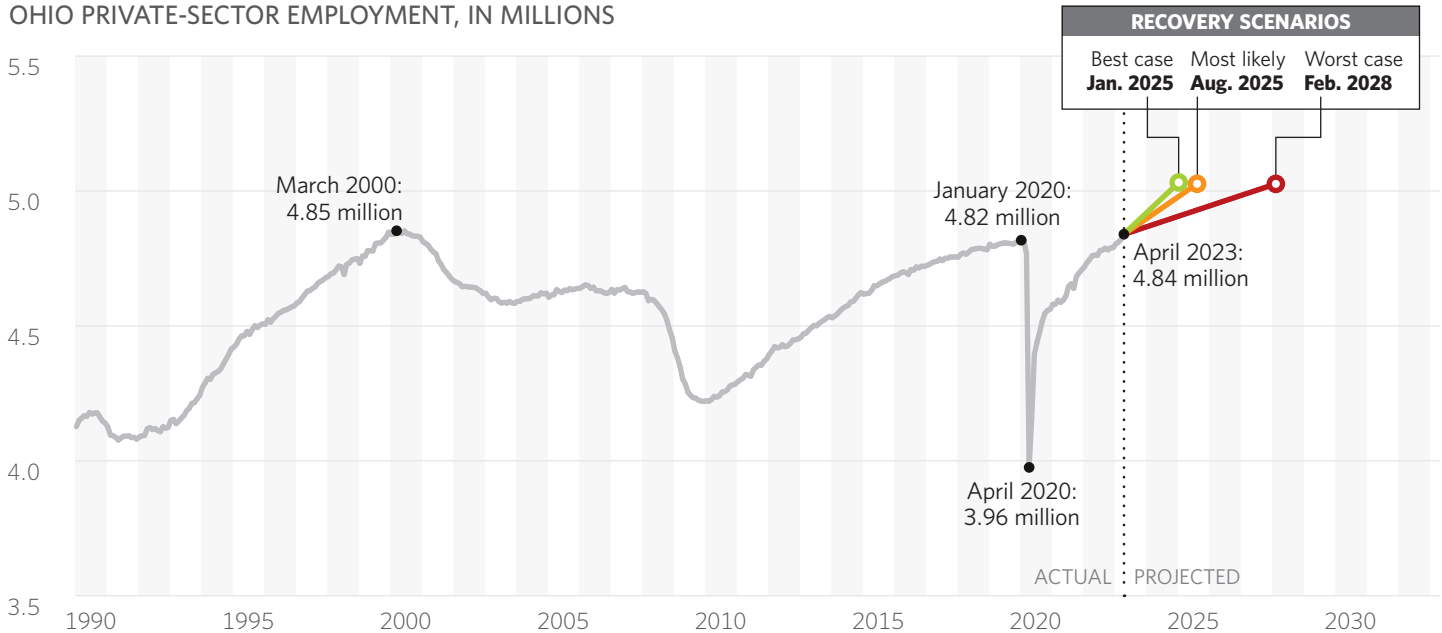

OHIO PRIVATE-SECTOR EMPLOYMENT, IN MILLIONS



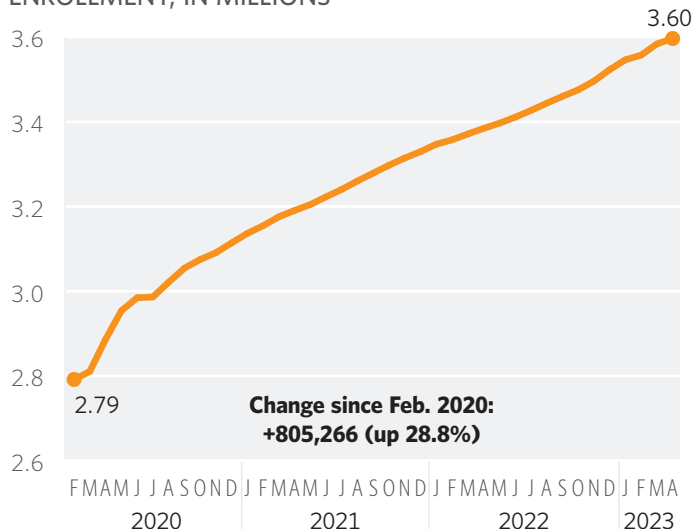

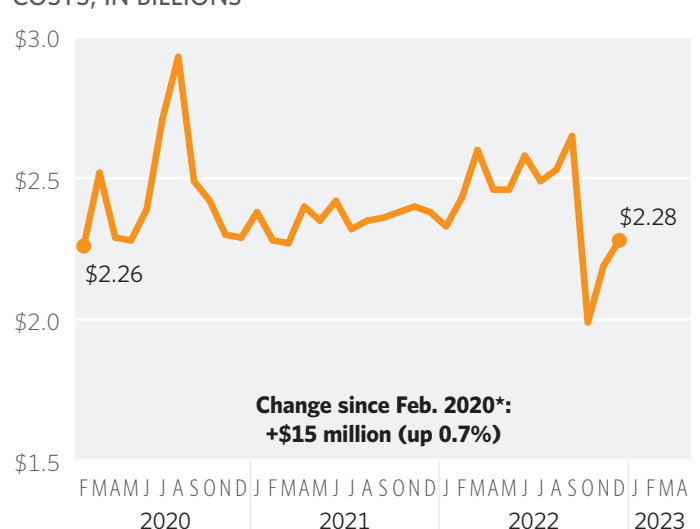


## Changes to Ohio Medicaid
