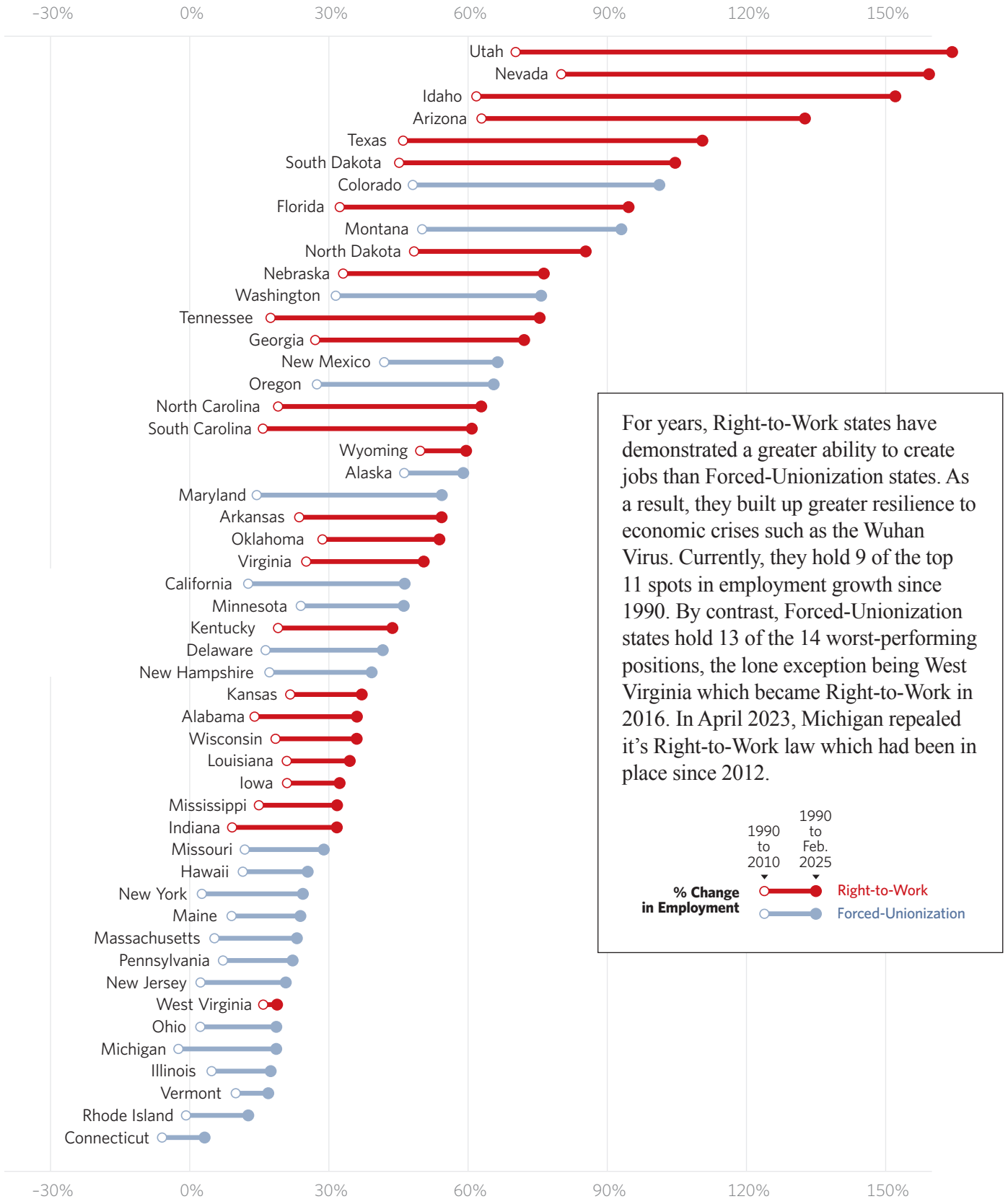


Right-to-Work States Dominate Economic Recovery



For years, Right-to-Work states have demonstrated a greater ability to create jobs than Forced-Unionization states. As a result, they built up greater resilience to economic crises such as the Wuhan Virus. Currently, they hold 9 of the top 11 spots in employment growth since 1990. By contrast, Forced-Unionization states hold 13 of the 14 worst-performing positions, the lone exception being West Virginia which became Right-to-Work in 2016. In April 2023, Michigan repealed it's Right-to-Work law which had been in place since 2012.
